Intercessors Testimony: A prayer group of women in Coeur d' Alene/Post Falls, ID felt led by a word of the Lord in March, to drive to the southern tip of Idaho, near Franklin & Preston, Id.

This is where Brigham Young first came into our state, even though he thought he was living in Utah at the time.

The Lord spoke and told us that we could not rid the state of Mormonism but that we were to break their illegal authority off of the state and to re-establish the covenant of the Lord over the land.

We did so, completing all that we felt led to pray over the site in Franklin, with taking communion there and pouring the wine over the ground where we had buried a key, as led by the Holy Spirit.

As we finished, we had been hearing a light pole humming, making noise as we prayed and we noticed that in the spirit the sound was actually the sound of a drum beat. There are Native Americans throughout the state.

We next went down the road 11 miles to Preston, ID where the largest Native American massacre in the U.S. happened by a Colonel in the California army. There seems to be a sacred tree there at the site, which is dead and broken off at this time, by the Native Americans there (it was covered with necklaces, jackets, face masks, shoes, etc. hanging off of the tree branches), we repented, wept and could feel the native American women's deep anguish and weeping in our spirits.

The Native Americans then joined the Mormon church at that time and so we broke off and prayed over the occultic structure that that created over the state.

We buried our two hatchets at the base of another tree that was alive and prayed joy over the land instead, as we had learned that the name Franklin means joy.

We especially felt led to pray for the women and the children and then the Lord gave us a beautiful picture of a Native American woman with a long skirt on and she said what is that? as she could feel something moving under her skirt. She lifted her skirt and there were Native American toddler children underneath, which then changed into a child about 2-4 yrs. of age, who brought the Word of the Lord (a Bible) to this woman as she sat on a chair and asked her to read it to them.

We declared that the younger Native American youth will teach the older about the Word. The Lord led us to pray over every little town in Idaho and Montana (2 of us on the trip lived in Montana for years, so we had authority there too) as we traveled home. So much more we could share, but it was a profound trip with the Holy Spirit and the Lord.

Prayer Points for Idaho

1. Pray for the Lord to unlock and uncover spiritual and natural treasure that God has kept hidden until now in the “Gem” state.
2. Pray that the unlocked treasure be used to affect the nation for the cause of Jesus Christ.
3. Pray that God unlock revelation.
4. Pray for a spirit of purity to be released in Idaho.
5. Pray for the strength and grace to “cross-over”.
6. Pray for hidden treasures to come forth.
7. Pray for a Cyrus anointing to come upon the church to subdue nations, open doors, and finance restoration.
8. Pray for an Acts 2 experience among the youth that seriously needs Christ
9. Pray that the state shaped as a lock would be used to unlock the judicial system in America
10. Pray for a Revival in the Mormon population. Idaho has more Mormons than Utah and more per capital than Salt Lake City.

Brief History of Idaho

State Capital: Boise in the Rocky Mountains

§ The first non-natives to arrive in Idaho were the Lewis and Clark expedition in 1805.

§ They were quickly followed by fur traders.

§ The state of Idaho was part of the Oregon country held jointly by the United States and Great Britain from 1818-1846. In 1846 the United States gained sole claim to Oregon country south of the 49th parallel by the Oregon Treaty with Great Britain. It became a territory in 1848 and a state in 1859.

§ A Mormon settlement was founded in Franklin in 1860.

§ Gold was discovered in 1861 which caused a rush of settlers to flood into Idaho.

§ As a result of this influx, the Native Americans were subdued and placed on reservations.

§ Then in 1862, some of the richest silver mines in the world were discovered.

§ Idaho then transitioned to cattle and sheep ranching and farming of agriculture such as potatoes.

§ In 1949, the Atomic Energy Commission built the National Reactor Testing Facility

§ From 2010 to 2020 the Idaho population grew at a pace of 17.3%

Interesting Facts:

§ Idaho is known for mountainous landscapes, and vast swaths of protected wilderness and outdoor recreation areas.

§ The Gem State is bigger than all of New England combined (Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island)

§ The total length of Idaho's rivers and waterways (over 107,000 miles) could stretch across the US thirty-eight times.

§ Idaho is nicknamed "The Gem State" because almost every known type of gemstone has been found in the state, including the largest diamond discovered in the U.S.
